Greensburg Community High School is pleased to announce the 2015 inductees into the Greensburg High School Hall of Fame. This year's recipients are:

David Robert Lewis- Mr. Lewis graduated from GCHS in 1879, the first African-American to have graduated from Greensburg. In 1894, he became Purdue University's first African-American graduate in their school of Engineering. After college, Lewis taught at Virginia's Hampton Institute for mechanical drawing and then went on to be a real estate broker in Pittsburg, Virginia.

Madelyn Anderson Ferris- Ms. Ferris graduated from GCHS in 1974 and then went on to receive her bachelor's degree from Ball State University. She would find herself working at PAWS INC, Jim Davis' creativity factory for Garfield the cat. She held the position of Senior Vice President of Operations for over 20 years and she is now their Vice President of Digital Marketing.

John Fogg- Mr. Fogg is a 1963 graduate from GCHS and served as a Marine Corps fighter pilot for 20 years, where he flew over 200 combat air missions in Vietnam. A graduate of the "Top Gun" Navy Fighter Weapons School, he was then selected to be a demonstration pilot for the Blue Angels, a presentation performing group of dare-devil pilots. In 2001, he served as the City of Pensacola Florida's first elected mayor since 1913.

This is the second class of inductees. Last year's inaugural group were: Oscar Ewing (1906), Kathryn Bailey (1932), John Stewart (1937), Fred Craig (1960) and Nanci Hellmich (1976).

Each year nominees are sought from the general public and a selection committee comprised of community and school leaders choose the winners. The recipients will be honored at a special ceremony that will take place in-between games (approx. 7:00 P.M.) the night of Friday, February 6th when the boys Pirate basketball team will face the Rushville Lions. A reception for the honored guests will immediately follow the end of the game.
